

Prescription Benefit Changes Effective April 1, 2021 Savings for Both You and Tabor Services



Retail 90 Program

Tabor Services employees and their dependents **will be required to use the Retail 90 program** through FutureScripts for maintenance medications (those drugs you take regularly for ongoing conditions) after two fills.

You and your family members can conveniently get a 90-day supply of your maintenance medications through mail order/home delivery or at a Walgreens pharmacy. **You will receive a 90-day supply for the cost of two retail copays if you utilize these options.**

If you do not fill your maintenance medications through mail order/home delivery or at a Walgreens pharmacy, **you will pay 100% of the cost of the drug.** The full list of maintenance medications impacted by this change and information on setting up mail order/home delivery is currently available on BenePortal (www.taborbenefits.com).

Enhanced Specialty Rx

Tabor Services will be partnering with US-Rx Care to fill specialty medications. Specialty medications are high cost drugs used to treat complex conditions (such as HIV and multiple sclerosis). You will no longer fill your specialty medications through FutureScripts. Tabor Services will continue to partner with Script Sourcing for certain specialty medications. By contacting US-Rx Care, you will be able to determine how to get your specialty medication at the lowest cost to you. Mandatory Generic Program

Tabor Services employees and their dependents **will be required to use the mandatory generic program.** This means that **if a member is prescribed a brand name drug when a generic is available, the generic drug will be filled** and the member will be responsible for the applicable generic drug copay.

When a prescription drug is not available in a generic form, the member will receive the brand drug and be responsible for the applicable brand drug copay. **If a member chooses to purchase the brand drug when a generic is available, the member will be responsible for the brand name drug copay plus the difference between the negotiated discount price for the generic drug and the brand drug.**

Please keep in mind that generic drugs are prescription medications that have the same active ingredients, dosage amounts, strength, safety, and quality as brand-name prescription medications at a lower cost.
